The primary inspiration was one of the formative tenants, Jane Conkey Bryant Lake. When Jane came to the West she was a penniless widow with three children looking to start a new life. Marrying Myron Lake may have ensured her financial security, but by most accounts Myron was a cruel husband and Jane's life with him was certainly not a happy one. It is rumored that Myron purchased the Lake Mansion for Jane in an attempt to save his marriage, but she filed for divorce (one of Nevada's first) in 1879 and after Myron's death in 1884 she was able to secure possession of the Lake Mansion. Though Myron's rage certainly took its toll on Jane, he never left his stamp on this house. The energy here is very feminine, perhaps because he never really inhabited the house. The movement and imagery in this piece draw from the simultaneous femininity and strength that are exemplified in both the enduring architecture of this home and its tenant, Jane Lake.
